

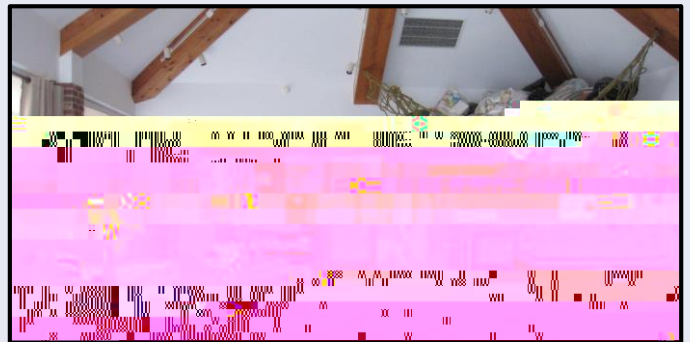


External Partner



Crane Mountain Landfill is part of the Fundy Regional Service Commission and is responsible for solid waste management in the Greater Saint John region of New Brunswick.

The Glenn Carpenter Interpretive Centre at Crane Mountain Landfill hosts 2,500 visitors per year, the majority being elementary and middle school students from across the region. Various educational materials and activities are available at the centre to teach conservation and sustainability in the region, with the scale model of the facility being a fan favorite.
