During scheduled breaks in the school year

For full-time, non-tenured career staff, the academic year will consist of a total of 10 months, 10 months of which will be spent in the classroom. The academic year will be divided into two semesters, each of which will be 5 months long. The academic year will begin in August and end in May.

Working full-time requires working 40 hours per week. Part-time jobs are defined as jobs that require less than 40 hours per week.

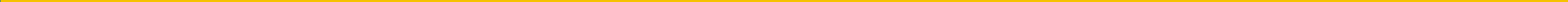
