

- You will receive a notice of your PGWP decision on your online Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) account. A hard-copy of your PGWP will be mailed to the address that you provided in your application. If you have not received your PGWP within 6 weeks of the approval, <u>contact IRCC</u>.
- If it is shorter than you expected, check your passport expiry date. Do they match? If so, you will need to renew your passport and then your <u>PGWP</u>. If you do not know why you received a shorter PGWP, <u>contact IRCC</u>. If you are still uncertain, contact NBCC at <u>international@nbcc.ca</u>.
- Are there any conditions about the type of work you can engage in?
- Make sure you have copies of all of your immigration documents, including your new PGWP. Save digital copies in a secure locations and print hard-copies for your records.
- Make sure to extend your SIN by visiting a Service Canada <u>location</u>. Follow the same steps as <u>applying for a new SIN</u>. The SIN number will remain the same but will have a new expiry date.



- If you need a TRV, then you will need to <u>apply online</u> and once the application is approved you will need to mail your passport to an IRCC office to have the TRV placed in it. The TRV would be valid for the same duration of time as your PGWP. NBCC has some TRV application guides available at <u>www.nbcc.ca/immigration</u>.
- If you need an eTA, you will <u>submit the application online</u>. You will receive a decision on your application quickly and an eTA will be valid for five years or until your passport expiry, whichever comes first.
