If your program is being delivered in a _____ :

The program will be delivered in a combination of online and on-campus learning.

It is essential that students be present in Canada to participate in the on-campus, in-person practical learning portions to meet all program requirements.

You must have the necessary immigration documentation to enter Canada (i.e. study permit and temporary resident visa/electronic travel authorization).

If you will not be able to travel to Canada to meet your in-person program components, you must contact the International Education Office (international@nbcc.ca) as soon as possible.

Please note: no upcoming terms of NBCC programs are being delivered in an entirely virtual format. If a program is listed as being delivered ONLINE, this means that it is not eligible for a study permit or a post-graduation work permit (PGWP).
